In 'Local History of Blyth', we will be exploring how daily life in Victorian Blyth was different in comparison to the present day and what industries made Blyth rich in the 18th century. In our second topic, 'Who First Lived in Britain?', we will explore what the 'Stone Age' was and what important changes took place during the Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic periods.

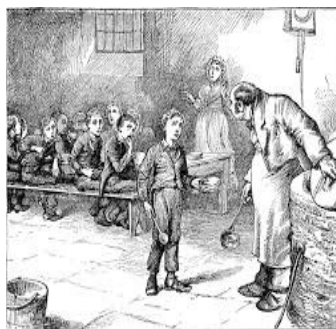
Creative Development

This term in art we will be exploring the artwork of the famous artist 'Claude Monet'. We will develop the children's painting and sketching techniques.

During music lessons we will be learning about pace, rhythm and pitch through our ukulele workshops on Tuesday afternoons running throughout the Autumn term.

Numeracy

This term, we will learn about place value, addition and subtraction and time. Emphasis will be placed on quick and accurate use of number bonds and times tables. Our learning in maths this will focus on applying our knowledge and understanding of place value including addition, and subtraction, to then solve problems.



Literacy

One of our class texts will be 'Oliver Twist' (abridged) by Charles Dickens. We will be studying the text as inspiration for writing different genres including setting descriptions, a diary entry and a non-chronological report.

Organisation: PE will be on a Wednesday morning with the NUFC and Friday afternoon where all children will have **swimming lessons**. Children need their PE and swimming kit in school each week for these sessions. **Spellings lists** will be handed out for children to practise at home. Please encourage this as much as possible. Please ensure homework is returned on the following Monday to avoid a consequence break. There is an opportunity to complete homework during break times if necessary. Children will receive a home reading book and record, which they must bring to school every day. We
