This half term we will be learning about:

- In the Summer Term in Year 2, we will be learning all about 'Grace Darling' in History and 'Island Life' in Geography. In Science we will be finding out about 'Growing Plants'.
- In English we will be using 'The Lighthouse Keeper' stories as our stimulus. We will be copying and innovating stories.
- We will also be doing more work using our times tables. Year 2 children should know 10, 2, 5 x table.

Please help your child learn them!

- We will also be having phonic, Basic Skills and Maths and English sessions on a daily basis.
- Our PE sessions are on a Tuesday and either Wednesday or Thursday so kits should be left at school for the week.
- Reading books and Home Reading Records should be brought to school each day.

Our targets

To achieve success this term the children will aspire to meet the following targets:

In writing

- To correctly form our letters
- To write in different ways, e.g. a story, a piece of non-fiction writing, a poem, a letter
- To use our knowledge of sounds to write difficult words
- To write in sentences using punctuation

In Reading

- To read sentences on our own
- Retell stories in the correct order, using story language
- Use non-fiction texts to find answers to questions

In Mathematics

- To use maths ideas to reason about and solve problems
- Use vocabulary related to addition and subtraction and add and subtract two 2digit numbers
- To mentally recall number bonds to 10 and 20
- To recognise, count and order numbers to 100 and beyond
- To use language such as greater, smaller, heavier, lighter, to compare qualities
