Spring Term in Year One

This half term in **English** we will be continuing to use traditional tales to inspire our writing. We will reading The Three Billy Goats Gruff and Rumpelstiltskin and then writing our own versions, changing one or two key features. We will then move on to read the more modern texts of Meerkat Mail and Handa's Surprise after half term.

These texts support our learning in other areas of the curriculum. Our first topic is **history** based, 'The Great Fire of Newcastle and Gateshead', and will include a trip to see where this dreadful event happened in 1864. Ms Newell will be studying bridges in **DT**, looking at the famous bridges over the River Tyne and how they constructed. I wonder if there's a troll under the Tyne Bridge? The children will design and make their own bridges and test them for strength.

In **science** we will be thinking about growth and survival and considering what animals need to survive and how to stay fit and healthy and exploring questions like 'Why can't meerkats live in the North Pole? and making our own meerkat finger puppets. We will compare different climates and how animals and humans adapt to live in hot and cold countries.

In **maths** our daily maths sessions we will be exploring the 'teens' numbers and learning different ways to add and subtract number up to 20 using the mastery approach. Our English and maths learning will continue to be supported by daily basic skills sessions including phonics, reading, spelling and arithmetic.
