It should be handed in every Monday morning.



Computing in the Spring term will include online modelling – very exciting! We will also continue to consider online safety. In the third week we have a very exciting Lego project as part of STEM week which will need all of our coding skills!

In History, we will be learning about The Shang Dynasty of ancient China. We will be looking at artefacts and exploring what they tell us.
