Reading books will be read weekly and changed when necessary for your child's reading development. – this is usually on a Wednesday

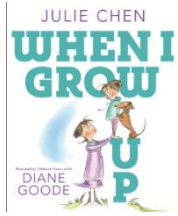

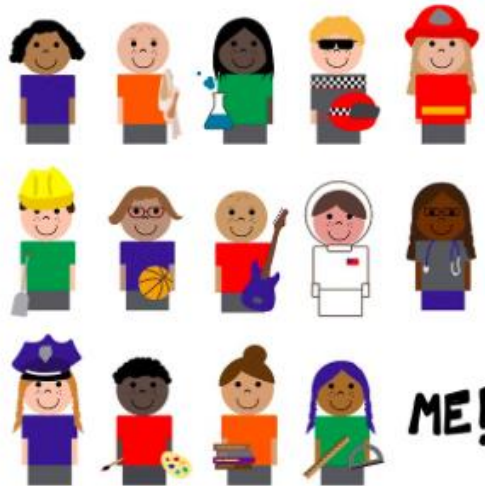

### When I grow up
