

YEAR 6 Summer NEWSLETTER 2024

Welcome back Year 6 and I hope you had a lovely Easter Break! During the Summer term we will keep working on our New Delaval characteristics – Resilience, Empathy, Self-Awareness, Positivity, Excellence, Communication and Teamwork. This term brings two exciting new topics, which the children will be studying – firstly, ‘The Arctic Circle’ will be our focus and after that, we will begin exploring ‘The Coast of Northumberland’.

In our ‘Arctic Circle’ topic, children will explore the following:

- How we locate exact position on our Earth using lines of longitude and latitude;
- Comparisons between the Arctic Circle and England;
- How does Svalbard compare with living in Blyth?
- How this environment is changing and the future impacts to our world.



In our Northumberland Coast topic, children will help direct our focus through their own lines of enquiry and interest.

One of our class texts this term will be ‘Shackleton’s Journey: a unique visual re-telling Ernest Shackleton’s landmark expedition crossing the Antarctic from one pole to the other. William Grill’s impeccably researched and informative illustrations celebrate the 100th anniversary since the historic exploration by Shackleton and his crew on Endurance.

After half term, we will be reading ‘Lambton Worm and Laidly Worm’ as part of our local theme during Summer 2.

Our science topics this term will be ‘Living Things and Their habitats’ and ‘Working Scientifically.’
