Autumn 2023

This half term we will be learning about:

- In our first term in Year 2, we will be learning all about where we live and our place in the world in our Geography lessons including exploring our local area. In History we will be learning about travelling out of this world with out theme of space travel and focus on Neil Armstrong and Tim Peak. In Art & DT we will be baking our own bread while in Science we will find out how amazing our bodies are!

Our targets

To achieve success this term the children will aspire to meet the following targets:

In Writing

- To correctly form our letters
- To write in different ways, e.g. a story, a piece of non-fiction writing, a poem, a letter and other genres of writing
- To use our knowledge of sounds to write difficult words
- To write in sentences, using basic punctuation

In Reading

- To read sentences on our own
- Retell stories in the correct order, using story language
- Use non-fiction texts to find answers to questions

In Mathematics

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- To use maths ideas to solve problems
- Use vocabulary related to addition and subtraction
- To mentally recall number bonds to 10 and 20
- To recognise, count and order numbers to 100 and beyond
- To use language such as greater, smaller, heavier, lighter, to compare qualities
- To use mathematical language to describe 2D and 3D shapes.
