Spring 2024—2025

Year Two

This half term we will be learning about:

In our second term in Year 2, we will be considering the cause and subsequent impact of the Great Fire of Gateshead and Newcastle, learning the events of this significant local disaster and creating our own bridge structures to investigate what makes a bridge strong. We will also be thinking about growth and survival and considering what animals need to survive and how to stay fit and healthy and exploring questions like 'Why can't meerkats live in the North Pole? ' and making our own meerkat finger puppets.

We will also be continuing to have Phonics and SPaG, Basic Skills, English and Maths sessions on a daily basis and focussing on Traditional Tales & Key Stories in English. In maths we will focus on Multiplication and Division, Statistics, Geometry, Fraction and Measurement.

Our PE sessions are on a Monday and a Thursday. PE kits, indoor and outdoor, should be brought to school on a Monday and left in school for the week.

Reading books—Your child will read regularly with an adult in school but should also aim to read at least one book per week using the online version of our school books via Bug Club. Each group will change books once per week according to the timetable on display on the classroom window and available on Google Classroom..

Our targets

To achieve success this term the children will aspire to meet the following targets:

In Writing

- To correctly form our letters
- To write in different ways e.g. a story, a piece of non-fiction writing, a poem, a letter and other genres of writing
- To use our knowledge of sounds to write difficult words
- To write in sentences, using basic punctuation

In Reading

- To read sentences on our own
- Retell stories in the correct order, using story language
- Use non-fiction texts to find answers to questions

In Mathematics

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- To use maths ideas to solve problems
- Use vocabulary related to multiplication and division
- To mentally recall number bonds to 10 and 20
- To recognise, count and order numbers to 100 and beyond
- To have rapid recall of x2, x5 and x10 tables.
- To use mathematical language to describe 2D and 3D shapes.
